


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



Will Investment in Foreign Entity be always considered as ODI?









Hey! Mr. FEMA Gyani. My company wants to invest in the instrument of a US company named Automation Inc. The company is engaged in new age technology of Artificial Intelligence, machine learning etc. It is being claimed as the probable rival in the world of AI. My company is also engaged in the similar kinds of business and wants to invest in the instrument which gives them right to acquire shares of Automation Inc. Can my company do so? Will this be considered as an Overseas Direct Investment(ODI)?

Hii Namish. Can you explain a bit more about this arrangement to acquire this instrument?



Sure. If the company raises money by selling shares (equity financing round), the investment we made will automatically turn into shares of the company. But if the company goes through a major event like being sold to another company (change of control) or going public (IPO), we will get our money back in cash, and the investment agreement will end.





No, Namish this will not be considered as an ODI. This means this is not allowed.





But why FEMA Gyani. My company will be investing in a foreign entity. Why shouldn't this be considered as an ODI? I thought any investment in the foreign entity is considered as ODI.

Let me brief you about the definition of ODI.





Overseas Direct investment means:

Acquisition of any unlisted equity capital or subscription as a part of the Memorandum of Association of a foreign entity



investment in 10% or more of the paid-up equity capital of a listed foreign entity



investment with control where investment is less than 10% of the paid-up equity capital of a listed foreign entity

As per the definition, The focus should be on the concept of ODI investment in **Equity Capital**.




FEMA Gyani can you explain what all are included under the term Equity Capital?





EQUITY CAPITAL



Based on the definitions of Overseas Direct Investment (ODI), investment can be made in Equity Capital. However, the specific instrument your company plans to invest in does not fall under the definition of Equity Capital. Consequently, this type of investment will not be considered as ODI and is therefore not permissible.
